The following is intended only as a quick reference guide to the scholarships available to local, international and traveling undergraduate students. Local Students

Australian Citizens, Australian PRs, NZ Citizens, and holders of Permanent Humanitarian Visas for Australia

Melbourne Access Scholarships

Annual allowance for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree as follows:

1st year \$6500
2nd year \$4000
3rd year \$3000

Number Available:
at least 150

Applicants must belong to one or more of the following Access Melbourne categories: recognition as an Indigenous Australian, difficult family circumstances, hardship caused by socio-economic circumstances, disability or long-term medical condition, non-English speaking background, from an under-represented school, completed school in a rural or isolated area, refugee status, mature age.

How to Apply: Submit an application for SEAS online at www.vtac.edu.au from 3 August 2009.

Closing Date: SEAS (including scholarships) applications close on 9 October 2009.

Melbourne National Scholarships

VCE and Victorian IB students receive a HECS exempt Commonwealth Supported Place, and \$5000 annual allowance for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree.

Interstate Year 12 and IB students receive a HECS exempt Commonwealth Supported Place, and \$10,000 annual allowance for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree, and one return flight home during the course.

Applicants must have an ENTER or equivalent of 99.9 or above (or be an Indigenous student with an ENTER of 90.0 or above), complete an Australian Year 12 or the International Baccalaureate (IB) in 2009, apply for a place in a University of Melbourne course in 2010 through VTAC and satisfy the prerequisite studies for their nominated course, not have undertaken any previous study at tertiary level excluding TAFE and extension studies undertaken as part of a Year 12 program, be an Australian citizen, Australian PR, NZ citizen, or holder of a Permanent Humanitarian visa for Australia and apply for a National Scholarship. Selection is based on academic merit as demonstrated by ENTER or equivalent and other information about course preferences provided by VTAC at the time of selection. The selection committee will not have access to change of course preference information.

How to Apply: Submit an application online to the Melbourne Scholarships Office from 21 September 2009.

Closing Date: 2 November 2009.

Number available: National scholarship applicants who have an ENTER or equivalent of 99.9 or above will be offered this scholarship. At least 2 will be reserved for indigenous students who have an ENTER of 90.0 or above.

National Equity Scholarships

Students receive a HECS exempt Commonwealth Supported Place, and \$5000 annual allowance for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree.

Number Available: 10

Applicants must belong to one of the following Access Melbourne categories: hardship caused by socio-economic circumstances, from an under-represented school, and/or completed school in a rural or isolated area. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit as demonstrated by ENTER or equivalent, and information contained in the SEAS application.

How to Apply: Submit an application for SEAS online at www.vtac.edu.au from 3 August 2009.

Closing Date: SEAS (including scholarships) applications close on 9 October 2009.

Mildura Alumni Scholarships

\$5000 annual allowance for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree, including an Honours year.

Number Available: up to 3

Applicants must be admitted to The University of Melbourne through Access Melbourne, have attended school and resided within a 250km radius of the Mildura GPO for at least 12 months preceding the date of their initial application for a scholarship and require assistance with the expense of moving to Melbourne, living expenses during their course, or tuition fees. Awards are based on consideration of the following Access Melbourne categories: completed school in a rural or isolated area, hardship caused by socio-economic circumstances, and/or from an under-represented school.

How to Apply: Submit an application for SEAS online at www.vtac.edu.au from 3 August 2009.

Closing Date: SEAS (including scholarships) applications close on 9 October 2009.

Indigenous Scholarships

The Centre for Indigenous Education administers the Indigenous Scholarship Program that provides specific scholarships such as housing bursaries, book vouchers, living costs and general grants. Applicants must: be able to demonstrate that they are an indigenous person of Australia and be able to demonstrate eligibility for the requirements of the scholarship.

Eleanor and Joseph Wertheim Scholarships

\$20,000 annual allowance

Number Available: up to 2

Applicants must be an unmarried female, at least 25 years of age at the application closing date, an Australian citizen or hold an Australian PR or permanent humanitarian visa, an undergraduate, graduate coursework or research student, currently enrolled full-time at the University of Melbourne (at least 37.5 points per semester), with at least 12 months left to complete their course, able to present evidence that they receive means-tested income from Centrelink and be able to demonstrate difficult circumstances. Difficult circumstances may include disability, and/or being a carer, having dependents.

How to Apply: Submit an application to the Melbourne Scholarships Office.

Closing Date: usually late March.

Kwong Lee Dow Young Scholars (KLDYS)

\$2,500 Relocation Allowance
\$2,500 Melbourne Global Scholarship (payable in second or third year of University study).

Number available: all eligible students will get a Relocation Allowance and/or a Melbourne Global Scholarship

Eligible students must have been nominated for the KLDYS Program by their school principal, based on academic merit and outstanding achievement, be offered a course place at The University of Melbourne and, for the Relocation Allowance, be from interstate or within one of the Victorian Government's designated rural areas. Please visit the Local Government Victoria's Department of Planning and Community Development website to identify Victorian councils which are zoned as rural.

How to Apply: No application is required for the Relocation Allowance. Eligible KLDYS will be automatically notified of the allowance offer by email in January. KLDYS must apply for their exchange/study abroad at their student centre and indicate on the form they are a KLDYS in order to get the Melbourne Global Scholarship.

International Students

Citizens of countries other than Australia or New Zealand, and not Australian PRs

International Undergraduate Scholarships

50% or 100% fee remission for the normal duration of an undergraduate degree

Number available:
Up to 10 x 50% fee remission scholarships.
Up to 10 x 100% fee remission scholarships

Eligible students must be a citizen of a country other than Australia. Australian permanent residents and New Zealand citizens are not eligible. Students must receive an unconditional offer of a place in a New Generation undergraduate course or the Bachelor of Engineering and not be receiving any other tuition scholarship. These scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit.

How to Apply: No scholarship application is required. Eligible students are ranked against other international applicants on the basis of academic merit. Successful candidates will be emailed an offer prior to their commencement in the course.

Travelling Scholarships

Melbourne Global Scholarships

\$2,500 for more than 12 weeks

\$1000 for less than 12 weeks

Number available: up to 800

Eligible students must be receiving faculty credit for their overseas study program, studying overseas full time, have a minimum 70% weighted grade point average across their entire course and not have already received a Melbourne Global Scholarship. In addition, exchange students must have completed 50 points and study abroad students must have completed 75 points.

How to Apply: Students must submit an application for exchange/study abroad to their student centre to be automatically considered for this scholarship.

Closing Dates:

31 Aug 2010 (travel Nov 2010-Apr 2011)

Melbourne Global Financial Assistance

\$2,000 one-off payment

Amounts may vary depending on available funds.

Number available: dependant upon funding

Applicants must be enrolled in the Melbourne Global Mobility Exchange Program, or a Study Abroad program of more than 12 weeks duration, or the Capitol Hill Internship (USA) Program, not have already received Financial Assistance. All Round 1 Financial Assistance applicants will be considered for the Aitchison Travelling Scholarship (one scholarship is awarded based on financial need with consideration given to academic merit. The value of this scholarship varies according to the funding available but is usually approximately \$5000).

How to Apply: Submit an application to the Melbourne Scholarships Office.

EAL Student Mobility Scholarships

\$5,000 one-off payment

Number available: 5

For incoming international students only. Applicants must be offered an exchange or study abroad course place by the University of Melbourne; be a high academic achiever and not receive any other scholarship other than for tuition fee remission.

How to Apply: Submit an application to the Melbourne Scholarships Office.

Closing Date: usually late October

Lorna Stirling Travelling Scholarship

Between \$500-\$4000 one-off payment

Number available: varies according to funding

Applicants must be enrolled at the University of Melbourne at the time of application and for the period of the proposed exchange or project and demonstrate how their project is relevant to the interests of the student population at large; and/or demonstrate how their project will enable mutual understanding to be established between students at the University of Melbourne and at the international university(s).

How to Apply: Submit an application to the Lorna Stirling Fund Committee.

Closing Date: Usually May.
